How to Celebrate

- **Provide creative tools:** Offer toys, games, and materials that promote critical thinking and invention.
- **Start a project together:** Work on a creative project with a child, whether it's designing a new gadget or building something from recycled materials.
- **Visit a museum:** Take a trip to a science or history museum to see exhibits and learn about inventions.
